

Special Session 5 **Re-imagining the future of women in food systems:** harnessing science, technology, and partnership to advance the SDGs

Tuesday, 15 April 2025, 13:30 - 15:00 p.m. Beirut time

Background and objectives

Gender inequality remains a significant barrier to transforming food systems in the Arab region. Women are disproportionately affected by food insecurity and malnutrition, especially in times of crisis, yet they are often excluded from decision-making processes. Despite their central role in food production and household nutrition, they face limited access to essential resources such as land, credit, agricultural inputs, and capacity-building opportunities, further deepening these challenges.

This special session will explore these issues and present inclusive, science- and technology-driven solutions to empower women in agrifood systems. By fostering partnerships and multi-stakeholder collaboration, the session aims to address structural inequalities and promote sustainable, inclusive, and equitable agrifood systems.

Questions to be addressed

- Identify challenges: Explore both persistent and emerging challenges specific to the Arab region that hinder women's equal participation and leadership in agrifood systems, including barriers to digital access, science, and technology.
- Showcase solutions: Highlight successful initiatives that leverage science, inclusive technology, and genderdisaggregated data to break barriers and empower women in agrifood systems.
- Strengthen SDG linkages: Examine the interconnections between SDG 5 (Gender Equality) and other SDGs under review, particularly SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals). Demonstrate how these goals can work together to drive sustainable and inclusive agrifood systems.
- Facilitate dialogue: Encourage multi-stakeholder discussions on actionable strategies and partnerships to address structural inequalities and advance gender equality in agrifood systems.
